Saline Cathartics		-removal of parasites -elimination of poisons -used as adjunct w/ hyperosmotic laxative (NU-LYTELY) for procedures -empties bowel in 2-6 hrs (oral) -used w/ patients who must avoid straining (hemorrhoids, heart pts)	-do not use w/ renally impaired; cannot excrete small fraction of salt (Mg) that is absorbed systemically
